**The Academic Report of Post Graduate Batch 2020-2022, NIMIT; Pongam.**

As this academic report for the Post Graduate Batch of 2020-22 goes out, Naipunnya is with its yearlong Silver Jubilee Celebrations and we recall the marvelous ways in which the college has fulfilled its mission in imparting education, moral and spiritual values and discipline to help build young leaders and dynamic managers who will hold themselves responsible for the development of the society. I am glad over the vast strides made during the past years especially when this PG batch of 2020-22 were with their campus life at NIMIT. The year 2019 has been a year when Naipunnya Institute of Management and Information Technology entered a new era of being a Self-Financing College in Kerala being accredited with NAAC B++ Grade. The academic stature of the existing faculty had improved tremendously with several faculty members upgrading their qualification and receiving the Ph.D and directly benefiting the students to critically analyse information and thus improve their academic writing skills. The batch 2020-22 started their academic pursuit with Shubharambh 2020, the initiation ceremony on 23rd November 2020 held online over the zoom platform. The orientation and induction sessions were arranged on the prior eve to capture attention and ensure participation.

**Curricular Aspects: Teaching Learning and Evaluation**

The teaching system was revamped as per the Choice Based Credit Semester System for Post Graduate Curriculum 2019 regulation for all PG Programmes affiliated to the University of Calicut, with the revised syllabus which came into effect for 2019 admission for the Programmes namely; MA English Language and Literature and M.Com.Finance

- The curriculum includes core course, elective courses and audit courses. The comprehensive Viva-Voce and Project Work were also the core course which was done towards the end of the semester on 16 and 19 of the August 2022 for the two programmes.
- Total Credits for the Post graduate programme, inclusive of electives is 80. The elective courses for MA English Language and Literature taught for the batch comprised of Women's Writing, World Drama, Indian English Fiction and Dalit Studies. The specialization electives for M.Com. with Finance comprised of courses on Investment Management, Financial Markets and Institutions, International Finance and Advanced Strategic Financial Management. The academic program objectives were aligned with audit courses as directed by UGC with a total of 8 credits aiming at ability enhancement and professional competency through writing skills and translation theory and practice for the students of the PG Department of English and with Presentation – Publication of Research Paper and Live Project with Statistical Packages for the students of PG Department of Commerce.
- Assignments, seminars and class participation were internal assessment components for evaluation. The students were continuously assessed through internal examinations and viva-voce. The evaluations were followed with remedial measures, peer teaching support and PTA meetings. University results of the three semesters declared till date have eventually proved very positive on the efforts put by the students.





### **Curriculum Enrichment and Significant Achievements**

Walk with scholar programme with advanced learners and Student Support Programme with remedial coaching were catered according to the need and requirement from time to time. Innovative methods and new contents in the curriculum were witnessed where in the students made right use of the openings by attending Faculty Exchange Programmes while they also participated in various seminars, workshops, inter-collegiate fest and competitions conducted by various associations keeping the academic year equally eventful and appealing. The PG batch 2020-22 explored the opportunity to earn while they learn by engaging in online and offline tutoring service. Also facilitating sale and purchase of products through the Friday Day Market a project of the ED Club.
