Ragging is a serious issue prevalent in educational institutions across the globe, including colleges. It often manifests as physical, mental, or emotional harassment inflicted upon newcomers by senior students. Recognizing the detrimental effects of ragging on students' well-being and academic performance, our college has taken proactive measures to prevent and eliminate ragging through various anti-ragging activities.

#### **Objective:**

The primary objective of conducting anti-ragging activities in our college is to create a safe and welcoming environment for all students, free from any form of harassment or intimidation.

#### Scope:

Applies to all students, faculty, and staff members within the college premises.

## **Activities Conducted:**

- Orientation Sessions: At the beginning of each academic year, orientation sessions are organized for both incoming students and second year students. These sessions emphasize the college's zero-tolerance policy towards ragging and educate students about its legal consequences.
- Awareness Campaigns: Regular awareness campaigns are conducted throughout the academic year to sensitize students about the negative impacts of ragging. Posters, and banners are strategically placed across the campus to spread awareness and encourage students to report any incidents of ragging.
- Anti-Ragging Affidavit Activity: Require students to sign an anti-ragging affidavit at the time of admission. The affidavit states their understanding and agreement to abide by anti-ragging regulations.
- Anti-Ragging Committee: The college has established an Anti-Ragging Committee comprising faculty member and student representatives. This committee is responsible for monitoring, preventing, and addressing any instances of ragging reported within the college premises.

- Counselling Sessions: Counselling sessions are provided to both victims and perpetrators of ragging to address underlying issues and promote behavioural change. Trained counsellors offer support and guidance to students, helping them cope with the psychological effects of ragging.

The Anti-Ragging Squad in our college is made up of teachers, staff, and security guards who work together to stop ragging. They walk around the campus, tell students about why ragging is wrong, step in when someone reports it, help students who have been affected, and work with the authorities. The squad makes sure everyone follows the rules against ragging, listens when people report it, and always tries to make the campus safer and friendlier.

- Helpline **Numbers:** Helpline numbers are prominently displayed across the campus and in student handbooks, allowing students to report incidents of ragging anonymously. These helplines are available 24/7 and are managed by designated faculty members who ensure prompt action against perpetrators.
- Workshops and Seminars: Interactive workshops and seminars are organized periodically to educate students about interpersonal communication, conflict resolution, and empathy. These sessions aim to foster positive relationships among students and cultivate a culture of mutual respect and understanding.

Anti-ragging awareness week: Anti -Ragging cell organized anti ragging awareness week from 12th August 2023 to 18th August 2023 for second year and third year students. Digital logo designing conducted in online mode. Poster designing, collage making and slogan making competition were also conducted. Prizes were distributed in the Common Assembly to the winners.



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#### **Outcomes:**

- Reduction in the number of reported ragging incidents.
- Increased awareness among students about the consequences of ragging.
- Improved trust and confidence in the college's administration to address ragging effectively.
- Creation of a supportive environment where students feel comfortable reporting instances of ragging without fear of reprisal.




