REPORT

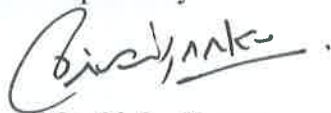

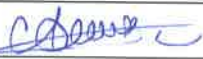
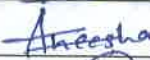
