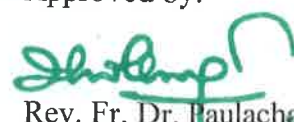

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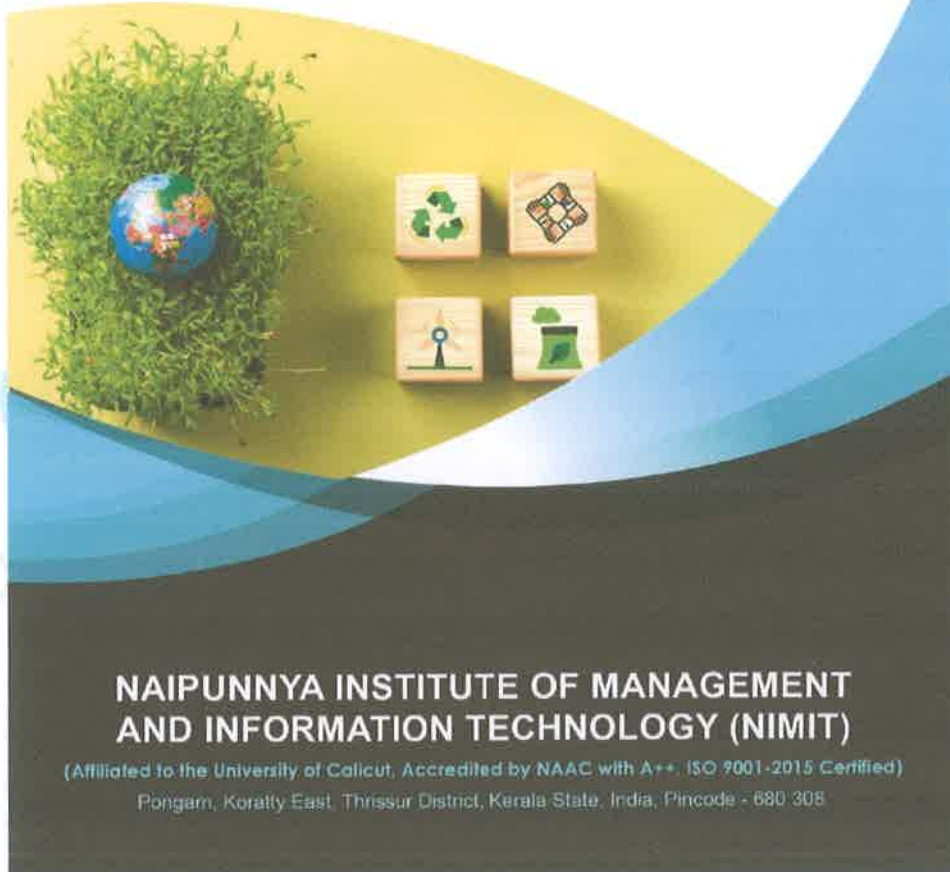

Dr. Nadia Ghounane is a full time faculty in the Dept. of English, Dr. Mouley Tahar University of Saida, Saida, Algeria and an accomplished researcher in the field of Sociolinguistics. She has done trail blazing works on euphemistic strategies and linguistic taboos in Northern African societies in general and Algerian Muslim women in particular. Her doctoral research at the Abou Bekr Bel Kaid University, Tlemcen explored eroticism in Arabic literature. Her areas of interest include Sociolinguistics, Cognitive linguistics, Discourse Analysis, Phonetics, Arab-English translation and Arabic-French translation. She has authored over thirteen articles in reputed journals and a book. She is also a team coordinator of national research project on "The Loss in and through Translation of the Algerian Novel from Arabic to French", funded by the federal government of Algeria.

Overview of the Sub-Theme

Pain, illness and the resolve to fight it out are deeply personal. However, when such illness and wellness experiences are given a narrative form, we get to feel the electrifying power of words to heal, to console, to inspire and to empower who suffer or who empathize with the suffered. Literature has an inherent capability to not just document an individual's fight against a terminal illness or an insurmountable health problem, but to amplify its innate buoyant spirit to invigorate and sensitize our collective consciousness to accept the realities as they are and to do our best to overcome any obstacle with whatever at our disposal. This is how deeply personal accounts become powerful political narrative for a larger cause. Thus, literature's role is second to none, in building an innovative, socially responsible, sustainable and harmonious world.
