REPORT

On 22nd August 2024, Ms. Simna Mary Manoj K. conducted a peer teaching session on the topic, Post colonialism for the III B.A. English students at Naipunnya Institute of Management and Information Technology (NIMIT), Pongam, Koratty, organised by the PG Department of English. The session commenced at 12:00p.m. and aimed to familiarise students with one of the most significant literary and cultural theories of the modern academic landscape.

Ms. Simna began by defining key terms such as colonialism, decolonisation, hybridity, and subaltern, grounding her lecture in the works of theorists like Edward Said, Homi Bhabha, and Gayatri Chakravorty Spivak. She discussed how literature from formerly colonised nations responds to and resists colonial narratives.

Her discussion included examples from African, Indian, and Caribbean literature, making the theoretical material more relatable and vivid. She explained how postcolonial writers reclaim identity, language, and history through storytelling, symbolism, and subversive techniques.

The session was intellectually stimulating, with several students contributing their thoughts and questions. Ms. Simna encouraged open dialogue, ensuring conceptual clarity and student involvement.

Her confident and well-structured presentation made the theory accessible and engaging. The session was a commendable academic endeavour that enhanced students' theoretical grounding and interpretive skills in literary studies.

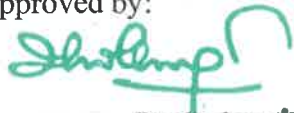

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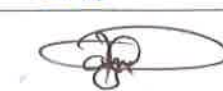
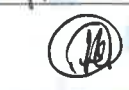
