REPORT

On 22nd August 2024, Ms. Simna Mary Manoj K. conducted a peer teaching session for the II B.A. English students at Naipunnya Institute of Management and Information Technology (NIMIT), Pongam, Koratty. The session, held at 2:30 p.m. and organised by the PG Department of English, focused on Charles Lamb's nostalgic and introspective essay, "Dream Children: A Reverie."

Ms. Simna began the session with a brief biography of Lamb, touching upon his personal tragedies and literary contributions as an essayist. She explained the theme of loss, longing, and unfulfilled desires portrayed in the essay, drawing attention to Lamb's imaginative narration and emotional vulnerability.

Her explanation of how Lamb uses the literary device of a reverie—a daydream or illusion—helped students understand the merging of reality and imagination in the essay. She also explored the psychological dimensions of the work, particularly its cathartic quality.

The class was actively involved, with students posing questions and sharing interpretations, which Ms. Simna welcomed and clarified with confidence. Her delivery was lucid, and her use of quotes from the essay added depth to the analysis.

The session was effective in bringing out the emotional and literary richness of the text, making it a valuable academic exercise for all participants.

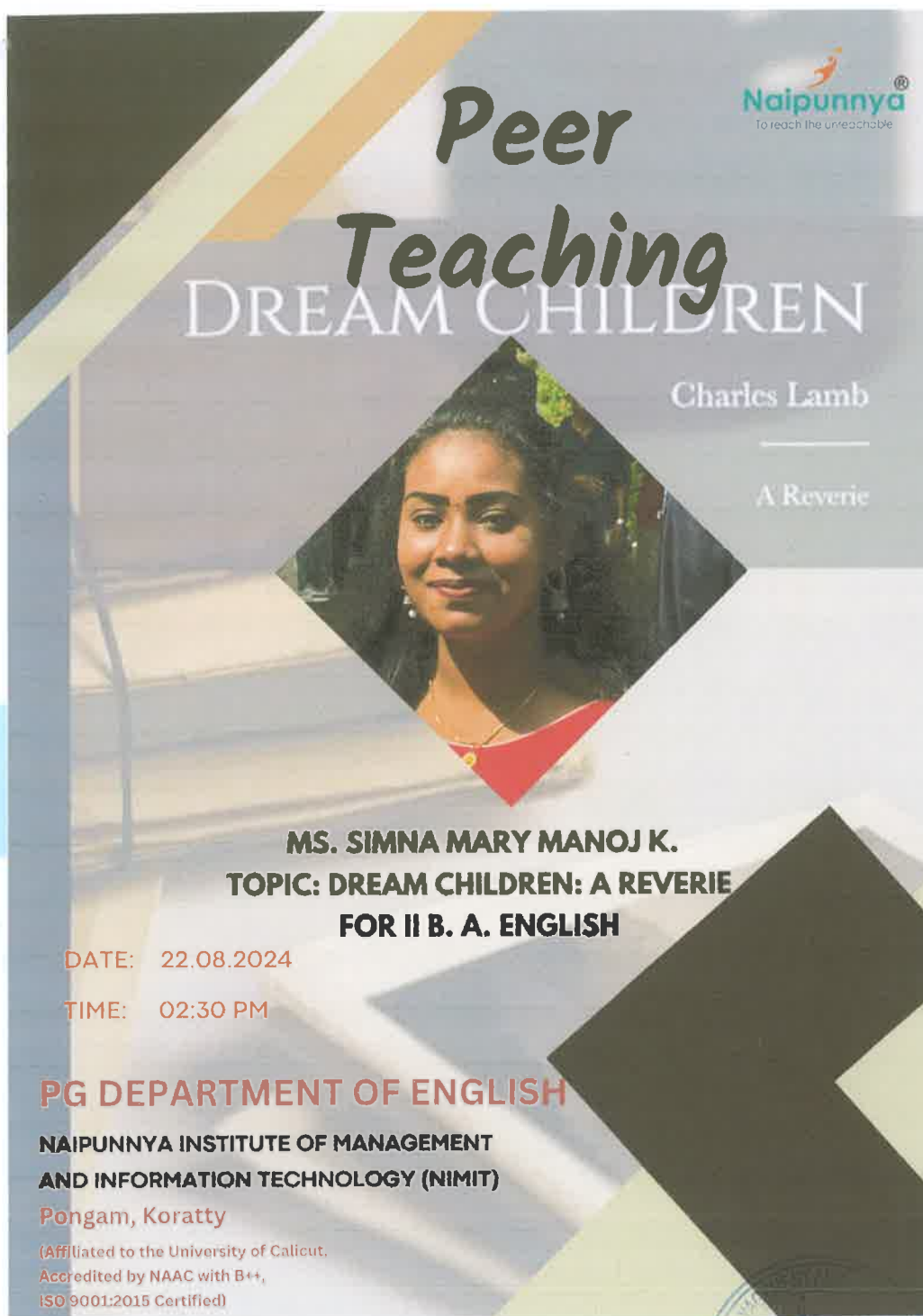
