Subject: Group Work Program – Skill Enhancement Group for Children

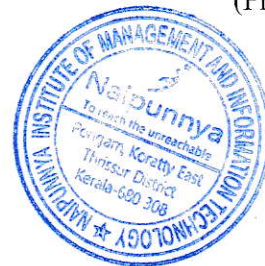

REPORT

As part of the field work initiative, the Department of Social Work organized a children's developmental group work program at St. Michael's Parish Hall. The program consisted of five interactive sessions, with the sessions on the following dates: 16/04/2025, 21/04/2025, 26/04/2025, 04/05/2025, 12/05/2025, from 11:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.

The primary objectives of this group work were:

- To develop leadership and group coordination skills.
- To build awareness on the theme of succession and teamwork.
- To foster interpersonal and communication skills among MSW students.
- To provide practical exposure to community-based group work.

The visual representation in the brochure (a baton-passing relay) reflected the core message: successful leadership involves preparing others to take the lead. Students participated in interactive games, role plays, and a mini-workshop on teamwork and responsibility sharing. Each group member contributed by handling logistics, anchoring, coordination, and participation. The faculty provided valuable input and support throughout the session.

The group work event titled "New Successors", held on 12th May 2025, was an initiative organized by MSW students of Naipunnya Institute as part of their academic and field learning activities. The program aimed to promote awareness on succession and leadership transition, particularly in social work and community engagement.

The event began at 11:30 a.m. in St. Michael's Parish Hall with an introduction to the objectives of group dynamics and shared leadership. The program featured symbolic activities such as role plays, baton passing games, and teamwork-based tasks that showcased the transfer of responsibility. Students reflected on how each member in a social system played a role in its continuity and growth.

Participation was active and vibrant. Each student played a role in planning and implementation. The group ensured smooth execution through clear communication, division of roles, and collective decision-making. The visual theme, inspired by a relay race, was chosen to metaphorically depict succession and mentorship. The program not only met its objectives but also strengthened the group's ability to work collaboratively, solve problems, and handle on-the-spot challenges. It reinforced the importance of preparing successors in leadership and sustaining efforts beyond individual contributions.

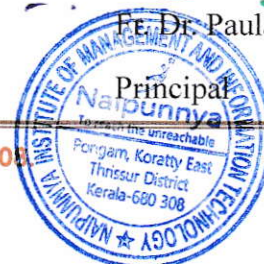

FEEDBACK

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After completing the series of five group sessions, feedback was collected from the children through informal discussions and observation. The responses were overall very positive, indicating that the program met its core objectives.

Participants appreciated the innovative theme of the program, especially the symbolic representation of succession and teamwork through the baton-passing concept. Many highlighted that the session was both engaging and thought-provoking, offering a new perspective on leadership and responsibility within group dynamics.

Several students shared that the interactive activities, including role plays and team tasks, allowed them to understand their strengths and areas for improvement in a group setting. They felt that the event promoted a strong sense of unity and cooperation among members.

The Faculty members praised the planning and execution of the program, noting that the MSW students demonstrated clear communication, division of responsibilities, and leadership qualities. They also acknowledged the relevance of the theme to social work practice and emphasized that such activities enhanced practical understanding of group work theory.

Some suggestions included adding a reflection session at the end and ensuring all students get equal chances to participate. Overall, the feedback indicated that “New Successors” was a well-received and impactful learning experience that fulfilled both academic and developmental goals.

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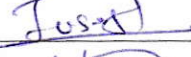
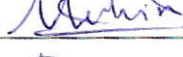
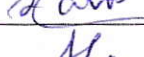
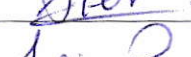
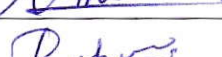
