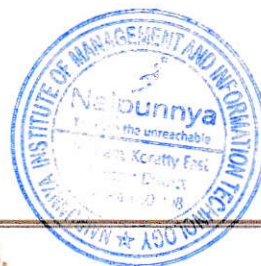


REPORT

As a Part of Second Semester Concurrent Field Work under the Dept. of Social Work, NIMIT, organized a group work-based closure event titled “രത്നങ്ങൾ” on the 17th of May 2025. The session took place from 11:00 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. at CEVA, Ernakulam. The primary objective of the program was to mark the successful completion of a child-focused group work initiative by celebrating the Adjourning Stage, while also reinforcing essential values such as cooperation, empathy, and inclusivity. Moreover, the program aimed to promote the role of peer interactions in the social and educational development of children. The event was rooted in core principles of group work. Participation and involvement were evident as children took part in various games and sharing sessions. A democratic environment was maintained by providing equal chances for every child to express themselves. The activities reflected individualization, as they were tailored to suit the developmental levels of each child. Furthermore, the event promoted acceptance and understanding by appreciating every child’s contribution without judgment. A flexible approach allowed facilitators to adjust the session based on the group’s mood and preferences.

Several engaging activities were conducted during the program. Group games promoted team bonding and cooperation. A reflection circle allowed children to share memorable moments and their learning’s from the group journey. Creative expression was encouraged through drawing and writing, helping children process their emotions. The program concluded with an appreciation ceremony where certificates and small gifts were distributed to acknowledge their participation and growth. The program was characterized by a child-centered approach and was intentionally kept short yet meaningful. Its interactive and play-based structure ensured active participation, and the emotionally supportive environment provided children with a safe space to discuss their feelings about the group ending. Though some children initially experienced emotional discomfort and hesitation, these issues were compassionately addressed through individual encouragement and group reassurance.

The importance of the session was multifaceted. It helped children process the concept of closure and transition, boosted their emotional resilience, and reinforced critical social skills like empathy and conflict resolution. By celebrating their achievements, both individual and collective, the program validated their experiences and growth. This event represented the final phase in Tuckman’s Group Work Model, which includes the stages of Forming (introducing the group and setting goals), Storming (managing conflicts), Norming (establishing trust and norms), Performing (effective teamwork), and Adjourning (ending and reflection). The program successfully embodied the essence of the Adjourning Stage by allowing children to conclude their journey together with dignity, joy, and insight.



The event was a valuable demonstration of how well-planned group work can contribute to the holistic development of children. It not only provided a structured emotional closure but also empowered the children with lifelong social and emotional skills, preparing them for future interactions and transitions.

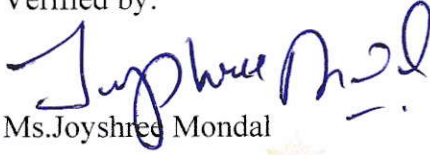
