COLLEGE DAY REPORT

The 23rd College Day of Naipunnnya Institute of Management and Information Technology for the academic year 2024-25 commenced with great enthusiasm and spirit on 06 March, 2025, at Navarang. The aim of the programme is to foster a sense of togetherness among students and staff, acknowledging achievements, encouraging participation and fostering a spirit of teamwork and growth. The event commenced at 01:30 p.m. with an introduction by the Master of Ceremony, followed by prayer by the College Choir, seeking blessings for the occasion. A formal welcome address was delivered by Ms. Samah Sanofer, Joint Secretary of the College Union, who extended a warm welcome to the gathering.

One of the key highlights of the day was the distribution of endowments for the I and II Year Undergraduate students, recognizing their academic dedication and achievements. This was followed by the prize distribution ceremony for various competitions and events, including Vismaya (Arts Day), Viva (Sports Day), Bhoomithrasena (Nature Club activities) and Best MERAKI, celebrating the multifaceted talents and contributions of the students.

The entertainment programmes, held from 2:30 p.m. to 4:00 p.m., brought energy to the afternoon session. Students from the I and II U.G. batches, along with teaching and non-teaching staff, presented a variety of music and dance performances. These performances captivated the audience and showcased the talent within the Naipunnnya community, turning the event into a lively celebration of unity and creativity. The day concluded with a formal vote of thanks by I U.G. representative Mr. Benjamin Thomas.

The second day of the College Day celebrations commenced on 07 March, 2025, featuring a series of official events, award ceremonies and cultural performances that reflected the institution's continued commitment to excellence, appreciation and community spirit. The day commenced at 09:15 a.m. with an introduction by the Master of Ceremony, followed by a welcome dance by the College Dance Club and prayer by the College Choir. The college report was presented by Rev. Fr. Dr. Paulachan K J (Executive Director & Principal), followed by the college union report by Mr. Joseph Thomas (General Secretary, College Union) and the NSS report by Ms. Theertha Suresh (NSS Volunteer), each highlighting the milestones and accomplishments of the institution over the past year.

The welcome address was delivered by Dr. Joy Joseph Puthussery (Dean of Studies and IQAC Coordinator), followed by the Presidential Address by Dr. Jacob P M, Director of Naipunnnya Business



School. Ms. Hannah K G, Vice Chairperson of the College Union, introduced the Chief Guest, Dr. Raju Narayana Swami, IAS, Principal Secretary, Parliamentary Affairs, Government of Kerala, who inaugurated the celebrations by lighting the lamp and delivering the inaugural address. Evaluation Report

College Day – CREARIS'25, NIMIT

College Day is one of the most significant annual events that brings together students, faculty, and distinguished guests to celebrate achievements and showcase talents. It serves as a platform to recognize academic excellence, extracurricular accomplishments, and cultural performances while fostering a sense of unity and pride within the institution. However, to ensure that the event remains engaging, well-structured, and inclusive, it is essential to evaluate its proceedings and identify areas for improvement. The College Day event had several aspects that require improvement for better inclusivity, engagement, and organization. The welcome dance, which should set the tone for the event, was perceived as being inclined toward a particular religious culture and lacked the warmth expected in an opening performance. To ensure inclusivity and a truly welcoming atmosphere, the dance should adopt a more secular and culturally diverse approach and style that resonate with the audience.

Additionally, the presence of the chief guest throughout the official function is essential to uphold the event's importance, and efforts should be made to invite a guest who can remain for the entire segment. The official programme was notably lengthy due to the distribution of numerous endowments and prizes, leading to audience disengagement and movement out of the auditorium. To maintain student interest and ensure a well-paced event, the official function should be limited to a duration of 1 hour to 1 hour 15 minutes, with only the most prestigious awards and endowments being presented during this segment. Other prizes and recognitions can be distributed at alternative occasions such as Common Assemblies or immediately after the respective competitions. If this approach is implemented, the College Day celebrations may be reduced to a single day instead of the current one-and-a-half-day format, making the event more streamlined and manageable.

Another critical area of concern was the lack of a final screening in full costume for class performances, particularly for boys, leading to instances of unethical actions. To maintain decorum and appropriateness, all performances should undergo a final review in full costume on the stage on the prior day before being performed.

Furthermore, to avoid last-minute corrections and unnecessary delays, proofreading of certificates should be ensured before printing, ensuring accuracy and saving both time and costs.

Overall, better planning and structural changes, such as improved time management, cultural sensitivity, structured prize distribution, pre-approved performances, and meticulous proofreading, will enhance the effectiveness and engagement of the College Day celebration.
