REPORT

The **Department of Fashion Designing** conducted a Parent-Teacher Association (PTA) meeting on **17th September** at **1:45 p.m.** in the **Navarang Auditorium**. The meeting was organized to review and discuss the academic performance of the first-year students based on the **First Internal Examination results**. The objective of the meeting was to strengthen communication between parents and teachers and to promote a collaborative approach towards improving students' academic performance and overall development.
